## AFTER IMOLA WAS WASHED AWAY, FORMULA 1 RETURNS ON THE GRANDEST STAGE OF ALL - MONACO

**THE 20** best drivers in the world will chase the coveted glory of winning the 80th edition of the Monaco Grand Prix.

Although the annual race around the Principality has its critics, it still captures the imagination like no other race can.

The sight of Formula 1 cars flying around the streets of Monte Carlo filled with yachts and skyscrapers never gets old as a callback to a bygone era.

Each corner from Sainte Devote to the Lowes Hairpin and Rascasse is truly iconic and full of stories.

Saturday qualifying is one of the highlights of the season with drivers coming as close as they dare to disaster in search of the all important pole.

The man who has taken the last two poles on offer is hometown hero Charles Leclerc.

Leclerc has pushed his Ferrari to the maximum and even beyond to qualify P1 since racing returned to the Principality after COVID-19.

However, a curse has hung over the #16 Ferrari with a driveshaft failure arriving before the start of the 2021 race and silly strategy dropped him from first to fourth last year.

Despite the SF-23 not having the outright speed, Leclerc will still give it everything to become just the second Monegasque after Louis Chiron in 1931 to win the famous race.

After another commanding performance in Miami, Red Bull

is the one to beat as Max Verstappen looks to extend his championship lead and Sergio Perez hopes to become just the third driver since 1995 to record back-to-back Monaco triumphs.

One of those who did the double was Fernando Alonso, who fancies himself not only scoring another podium, but even challenging for victory in his Aston Martin.

Alonso can take inspiration from Ayrton Senna in 1992 and Daniel Ricciardo in 2018 that the underdog in a significantly slower car can fend off the favourite.

It will be interesting to see if a new upgrade package can bring Mercedes closer to the front, while Oscar Piastri and Lando Norris will be happy to score points in their special "Triple Crown" livery celebrating McLaren's 60th anniversary.

To add another layer of difficulty to the challenging streets of Monte Carlo, showers are forecast to wreak havoc on both Saturday and Sunday of the race weekend.

Last year's race was also impacted by the weather starting under Safety Car before a red flag arrived, while just think back to 1996 to see how water can affect a Monaco Grand Prix.

Get ready for the 80th chapter of the Monaco Grand Prix fairytale!





## ROUND SEVEN MONACO GRAND PRIX MAY 28-20



#### **TEAM PRINCIPAL CHRISTIAN HORNER**

Just when Sergio Perez's title push was gathering steam, Max Verstappen delivered a crushing blow at Miami. Verstappen looked unstoppable when compiling one of his finest drives to easily win from ninth. After not being happy about strategy relegating him to third last year, the Dutchman hopes to repeat his 2021 win at the Principality.





#### **TEAM PRINCIPAL MIKE KRACK**

POINTS

For the first time in a decade, Fernando Alonso has a genuine shot at taking his third Monaco Grand Prix victory. The Aston Martin driver has four podiums from five races this year with the latest recorded at Miami. Could be a massive thorn in Red Bull's side if he gets his elbows out.



#### **TEAM PRINCIPAL FRED VASSEUR**

Off the back of consecutive top five results, Carlos Sainz has built some momentum as he hunts a hat-trick of Monaco podiums. Although the Scuderia was off the pace at Miami, Sainz led the campaign. The Spaniard has happy Monaco memories with a pair of second places in each of the last two years.



#### TEAM PRINCIPAL FRED VASSEUR

Can Charles Leclerc's Monaco curse be broken in 2023? Despite taking pole in each of the last two races, cruel luck has got in the way of Leclerc's hopes of a dream win. After pushing too hard in quali, Miami was a step backwards, but the #16 hopes the home support can provide some extra speed.



As McLaren shows off a special 60th anniversary livery, Lando Norris hopes he can produce a similar result to when the team last used a one-off look at the Principality. In 2021 Norris took a Gulf McLaren all the way to the podium, but a repeat result is unlikely after a third P17 of 2023 at Miami.



#### TEAM PRINCIPAL CHRISTIAN HORNER

Sergio Perez will be looking to relaunch his title push after being dealt with a tough defeat in Miami. Perez should have won from pole, but could not stop his teammate from fighting back. However, the Mexican performs best at street circuits and will use last year's win as motivation to take on Max.



Lewis Hamilton arrives at the Principality in the headlines with the rumour mill hinting Ferrari has launched an expensive bid to poach the star Brit. On track Hamilton hopes to maximise a new upgrade package. Post COVID Monaco races have not been great with car #44 only finishing 7th and 8th since his 2019 win.



#### **TEAM PRINCIPAL TOTO WOLFF**

George Russell has his sights set on the top five in the championship having scored his equal best result of the year at Miami. A P4 was a good response after retiring in Australian and 8th in Baku. Hopes the new Mercedes upgrade can help him chase a maiden 2023 podium.



#### **TEAM PRINCIPAL MIKE KRACK**

After a tough Miami Grand Prix, Lance Stroll hopes to bounce back in Monte Carlo. As Alonso cruised to another podium finish, Stroll battled qualifying 18th and finishing 12th. Monaco has not been his favourite track either with just one points finish in five attempts.



#### **TEAM PRINCIPAL OTMAR SZAFNAUER**

Following a pair of disappointing races, Alpine would have been pleased to see Pierre Gasly lead home his teammate in the points at Miami. Gasly is in the top 10 of the championship after a third points finish. Despite starting 17th, the Frenchman came within 1s from the top 10 last year.



#### TEAM PRINCIPAL GUENTHER STEINER

A driver looking to regain ground on his teammate will be Nico Hulkenberg. Although Hulkenberg still sits well ahead of Magnussen in the championship, the Dane outdrove the German at Miami. Ready for his first trip to Monaco in four years and hopes his pattern of points there in every second appearance continues this weekend.



#### TEAM PRINCIPAL ALESSANDRO ALUNNI BRAVI

Despite showing improvement in Miami, Valtteri Bottas still has just one points finish from 2023. But Miami was a step in the right direction and he has spent the break completing a cycling race in Scotland. Last year Bottas scored his first non Mercedes points at Monaco.



#### TEAM PRINCIPAL ALESSANDRO ALUNNI BRAVI

Chinese racer Zhou Guanyu hopes to close in on his teammate in his second Monaco Grand Prix. Last year he stayed out of trouble to finish 16th, but has had success at the famous circuit before winning a F2 sprint in 2021. Hopes his C43 better suited to slower speed corners comes into its own at Monaco.



#### **TEAM PRINCIPAL GUENTHER STEINER**

Kevin Magnussen is primed for Monaco after the best weekend of 2023 so far. Magnussen qualified an impressive fourth before doubling his points total with 10th at Miami. The Dane is in for a greater challenge at Monaco where he has not scored points since 2017.



After putting a difficult maiden home race behind him, Logan Sargeant is keen for a fresh start on the streets of Monte Carlo, Sargeant had a torrid Miami GP. qualifying and finishing last after an early incident with Lance Stroll. But the challenges will keep coming at the toughest track of them all.



Esteban Ocon gave Alpine some points to cherish after a challenging season so far. In response to two tough rounds in Australia and Azerbaijan, Ocon scraped into the points with a consistent weekend in Miami. Missed the top 10 last year, but has always reached the chequered flag at Monaco.



#### **TEAM PRINCIPAL ZAC BROWN**

Oscar Piastri will be easy to spot on the streets of Monaco driving a special red, white and black "Triple Crown" livery. Piastri hopes it can find some extra speed after a tough Miami where he battled mechanical issues to 19th. The Aussie has had a taste of the famous street circuit with a pair of second places in F2 in 2021.



#### **TEAM PRINCIPAL FRANZ TOST**

Yuki Tsunoda continues to impress during an ultra consistent start to the 2023 season. He has finished all five races either 10th or 11th, but if he is to keep this streak alive he must improve his Monaco output. Crashed in quali last year and only finished 17th, but has shown greater composure since.



#### **TEAM PRINCIPAL JAMES VOWLES**

Points were possible in Miami for Alex Albon, but he had to make do with a P14. Albon was overwhelmingly the leading Williams last race qualifying 11th, but unlocking similar speed could be harder at Monte Carlo. Albon retired last year due to mechanical issues, but finished his first taste in 2019.



#### **TEAM PRINCIPAL FRANZ TOST**

Nyck de Vries thought he found the breakthrough of confidence he needed so much at Miami. De Vries out qualified his teammate, but threw it all away by running into the back of Norris at the start. Needs to show some promise at Monaco to stop the rumours from circulating.
