

# EVENT GUIDE AUTO ACTION'S 2023 PRE SINGAPORE FORMULA ONE TEAM-BY-TEAM EVENT GUIDE

### RED BULL AND MAX VERSTAPPEN MADE HISTORY IN ITALY AND NOW THE CHALLENGE IS TO SEE HOW FAR THEY CAN TAKE THEIR DOMINATION.

WITH THE European season now in the rear-vision mirror, the popular Singapore but tied with Alpine's Esteban Ocon. night race awaits as a glitzy way to start the run home.

Whilst Verstappen appears impregnable at the moment, the Marina Bay Street Circuit has not been a Red Bull backyard in recent times and could offer the best chance of ending the unbeaten streak.

Since Sebastian Vettel completed a three-peat in 2013, Red Bull has only won under the Singapore stars once.

That occasion was last year when Sergio Perez put in an inspired drive to win a tense weather affected race.

But Ferrari probably possessed the outright pace on that occasion with Charles Leclerc taking pole and crucially Verstappen only managing seventh.

Not only have the cars changed for 2023 but so has the track itself with the third sector receiving a significant revamp.

Gone is the tight, technical and awkward set of 90-degree corners that run underneath the Bay grandstand.

Instead the cars will continue blazing down Raffles Avenue to the final right-left before the final corner.

It has been forced because of works being done to turn the existing floating platform which sat directly alongside the track into a NS Square "permanent space".

The change should present more passing opportunities and it could also help McLaren, which has a weakness through low-speed corners.

Australia's Oscar Piastri will take on the Marina Bay Street Circuit for the first time and has a big chance to move up the order, currently sitting in 12th,

Other battles to look out for in the championship is for third with Fernando Alonso once again under pressure from Lewis Hamilton.

However, expect Aston Martin to be a much stronger force than in Italy, having pushed Red Bull at Monaco.

Behind them the fight for fifth is also intriguing with just eight points separating Carlos Sainz, Charles Leclerc and George Russell.

Sainz is the man with the upper hand however, following his sterling effort to salvage pole and third at Monza.

As incredible as its home race was, this will be a bigger test for Ferrari to see if its resurgence was for real or just a track specific flash in the pan.

Kiwi Liam Lawson will enjoy another crack for AlphaTauri with Daniel Ricciardo still nursing his broken hand.

Rain has been a major factor in recent Singapore Grands Prix, but this year the night sky should stay clear.

But no matter the weather, it will remain one of the toughest torture tests for the drivers with up to two hours of pushing the limits in a 30-plus degree sauna.



Max Verstappen became the first driver to score 10 straight Grand Prix wins in Monza and has more unwritten records in his sights. Strangely he has never won in Singapore and has just two podiums from six starts. Struggled to seventh last year, almost a minute behind winner Perez, but 2023 should be a different story.

### **TEAM PRINCIPAL MIKE KRACK**

Singapore is a big weekend for Fernando Alonso and Aston Martin with the pair targeting the race as a chance to topple Red Bull. They need to bounce back from a tough Italy where they were off the front-running pace. Alonso has two wins at Marina Bay and qualified a solid fifth on return last year only for the Renault engine to die.

Lewis Hamilton was lucky to get away with sixth at an eventful Italian GP where he chopped off Piastri's nose. It keeps Alonso in check and Hamilton knows how to get the most out of the car at Singapore with four wins and poles, highlighted by a mighty lap in 2017.



Carlos Sainz is on fire at Ferrari with his Italian Grand Prix one of the most complete of his career. A sensational lap at the death was enough to snare pole and send the Tifosi wild, while he fought like hell throughout the Grand Prix to secure a first podium of 2023 at the most special place. Also finished third at Singapore last year.

Lando Norris made the most of a team supported undercut to jump Piastri and get points in Italy to extend his scoring streak to six races. Has only two starts at Singapore but made the most of them on both occasions, including a strong fourth place last year which was one of two top fives in 2022.

# **TEAM PRINCIPAL TOTO WOLFF**

P5 was the "maximum" George Russell could have hoped for at Monza, but he still walked away "not satisfied". After a disappointing result at Zandvoort, it was a strong bounce back for Russell. Battled at Singapore last year finishing two laps down having started from the pits due to an engine penalty and clashed with Mick Schumacher.

### **TEAM PRINCIPAL BRUNO FAMIN**

The up and down nature of Pierre Gasly's season continues after he followed up his Dutch podium with a tough 15th place. The Frenchman described Monza as "a very painful afternoon" after a Q1 knockout. Scored his final points for AlphaTauri at Singapore last year.

### **TEAM PRINCIPAL MIKE KRACK**

Lance Stroll had another tough time in Italy, finishing down in 16th having been "just slow all weekend" as the disparity between Canadian and his teammate continues to grow at an alarming rate. Stroll at least can turn to Singapore last year for some confidence where he finished sixth, easily his nest result of the year.

### **TEAM PRINCIPAL JAMES VOWLES**

One of the form drivers on the grid is Alex Albon, who is maximising the most out of his Williams. Albon backed up his strong P8 with an even better seventh place at Italy and had to get his elbows out to achieve it. Crashed at Singapore last year but got a solid sixth for Red Bull in 2019.

Fortune was not on Oscar Piastri's side at Monza as points slipped away. He out-qualified Norris and held track position for the first part of the race only for McLaren to give the undercut to his teammate which put the Australian behind and later on Hamilton's chopping block. In the end he had to settle for 12th and is preparing for a new challenge racing at Marina Bay for the first time.

A fast start was "the only positive" for Nico Hulkenberg as he battled to 17th at Italy after starting 13th. Has not raced at Singapore since 2019 and was on track for a maiden career podium in 2017 only for an oil leak to end his promising night.



### TEAM PRINCIPAL ALESSANDRO ALUNNI BRAVI

"Nailing the strategy" helped Valtteri Bottas return to the points for the first time in six races at Monza after starting 14th. Also made up ground in last year's Singapore Grand Prix, but has only got one podium during his Mercedes days and will chase more points with an upgrade.

### TEAM PRINCIPAL ALESSANDRO ALUNNI BRAVI

Alfa Romeo and Zhou Guanyu are looking to "make a massive step" with the upgrades arriving at Singapore this weekend. As Bottas moved up, Zhou could only manage 14th. Only trip to Singapore was a disappointing one, crashing on lap six with Latifi.



Yuki Tsunoda will be looking forward to some racing laps to prove a point at Singapore. An engine failure meant Tsunoda could not complete the formation lap and start the race in Italy. A poorly timed one having been beaten by Lawson at Zandvoort. Crashed at turn 10 in last year's race.
