# ONE RACE AFTER RED BULL WRAPPED UP THE CONSTRUCTORS CROWN, MAX VERSTAPPEN COULD SECURE ANOTHER PIECE OF SILVERWARE IN QATAR.

VERSTAPPEN IS on the verge of taking a hat-trick of Formula 1 world championships, which will send him straight into the conversation of all-time greats.

After such a crushing season, the task for the flying Dutchman is simple.

Even if Sergio Perez wins the Saturday Sprint race, Verstappen will be champion if he finishes sixth or better.

Meanwhile the Mexican needs at least a podium finish and his Red Bull teammate to miss the points if he is to keep the championship alive for another day.

Even if that does happen, Verstappen would only need eighth in the Grand Prix to wrap it all up regardless of how well Perez does.

With Juan Manuel Fangio, Michael Schumacher, Sebastian Vettel and Lewis Hamilton the only drivers to record three-peats in the 73-year history of Formula 1, Qatar should be a historic weekend.

After Red Bull responded to a rare Singapore slip emphatically with Verstappen being at his dominant best at Japan, the mountain for teams to climb just to challenge for victory is steep.

Mercedes will bring a significant upgrade package to the W14 and hopes it can propel them ahead of their rivals.

The black arrows are in the middle of a battle for second in the constructors with

longtime rivals Ferrari and enjoy a 20-point advantage.

Despite not being in that particular battle, McLaren is the team Mercedes wants to catch.

The papaya squad enjoyed a new highlight in Suzuka with Australia's Oscar Piastri scoring his maiden career podium, one place behind runner-up Lando Norris.

There was no doubt McLaren was the second fastest car in Japan and it will be confident of carrying the momentum into Qatar which is also full of high-speed


Drivers and teams will have to step two years back in time to find the one and only Qatar Grand Prix.

With that race taking place in 2021, this year will be an entirely unique challenge in the new cars.

On that occasion Mercedes was the team to beat with Lewis Hamilton enjoying a peerless run to the chequered flag as Verstappen had to fight for second following a power unit related grid penalty.

Piastri has never raced at Qatar and neither has Lawson, who could be suiting up for AlphaTauri for the final time in 2023.

With Bathurst going all day and Formula 1 racing under lights during the night, it is a dream weekend for motorsport fans.

# ROUND QATAR GRAND PRIX - OCTOBER 6-8

FOR JUST the second time Formula 1 will be racing under the Lusail lights in Qatar. The race made is maiden appearance in 2021, but was skipped last year due to the FIFA World Cup. Well known to MotoGP fans, the Lusail Circuit is fast and full of high to medium speed sweeping bends. The track itself was constructed in 2004 ahead of its MotoGP debut on the outskirts of Doha.



Fell second best to Hamilton in an all Mercedes Japanese duel at the Spoon Curve and had to settle for seventh. In the end the younger Brit claimed it was "just part of racing". Only trip to Qatar was in the Williams days and finished two laps down.



The good times keep on rolling for Lando Norris as another second place saw him surge past George Russell in the standings. Although Piastri can beat him in qualifying, Norris appears to have the measure over a race distance and bolted clear in the middle phase of the race. Was easily the leading McLaren at Qatar in 2021.

Oscar Piastri is on a high having just scored a maiden Formula 1 career podium. Piastri was brilliant in his first weekend driving the upgraded MCL60, qualifying second only to Verstappen and driving a solid race to third. The Aussie now has a 10-point buffer over Stroll and has all the confidence in the world before heading to Suzuka.


# TEAM PRINCIPAL GUENTHER STEINER

Just like his teammate Kevin Magnussen has never raced in the Qatar Grand Prix. Aiming to bounce back from Japan where a collision dramatically disrupted his weekend. The Dane was spun by Perez, who made a "pretty desperate move that ended our race" according to Magnussen. Still made the finish to be 15th but last on track.

Despite being able to finally complete the opening lap, Yuki Tsunoda would have been disappointed with his Japanese GP performance. In front of his adoring home fans Tsunoda finished 12th, notably behind teammate Lawson after a wheel-to-wheel battle. Having beaten the Kiwi to a 2024 seat, he will want to remind the doubters why.
