

EVENT GUIDE AUTO ACTION'S 2023 PRE UNITED STATES FORMULA ONE TEAM-BY-TEAM EVENT GUIDE

THE CHAMPIONSHIP TITLES MAY BE ALL DONE AND DUSTED, BUT THERE IS STILL PLENTY TO PLAY FOR AT THE UNITED STATES GRAND PRIX.

FOR THE second time this year Formula 1 is racing in America at the familiarly twisty Circuit of the Americas.

With Red Bull back in winning form, Max Verstappen will be confident of taking a hat-trick of United States Grand Prix wins having already wrapped up a three-peat

Despite Verstappen's strong form it is McLaren with all the momentum heading to

The papaya squad has scored 104 points over the last three race weekends, more than Red Bull (74) Ferrari (70) and Mercedes (63).

Importantly Aston Martin has only scored 13 in this period, meaning the fight for fourth in the constructors championship is down to just 11 points.

Leading the charge has not been Lando Norris, but Aussie rookie sensation Oscar

Fresh from a first podium, Piastri showed greater speed in Qatar, converting a Sprint Shootout pole into a Sprint win.

The Brighton boy also followed up the stunning Saturday with a strong second

place in the race, just 4.8s behind Verstappen.

McLaren may receive a sterner test at COTA with Ferrari and Mercedes the only teams other than Red Bull to win there in the last decade.

Mercedes will also be armed with a significant new upgrade to the W14 which could also offer a glimpse into the team's plans for 2024.

Further back in the grid AlphaTauri will be alive with Daniel Ricciardo's trademark smile back in the garage.

Ricciardo will be racing again for the first time in five races having recovered from the broken metacarpal in his left hand sustained from a Dutch Grand Prix practice

It arrives at one of his favourite places Austin, which was not one of his favourite races last year when he finished 10 positions and almost 40s behind Norris.

But he is at a new team in AlphaTuari and making a second fresh start of the year. For the second weekend in a row the Sprint format will be utilised which has never been seen at the snaky COTA circuit.





ROUND UNITED STATES GRAND PRIX - OCTOBER 20-22

FOR THE second time this year, Formula 1 is racing in America. This time the familiar Circuit of the Americas is hosting racing stateside having been part of the calendar since 2012. The constant flowing nature of left-right corners genuinely produce close and exciting racing. The pinch point at the end of a steep climb to turn one can also cause chaos.





With a hat-trick of world championships under his belt, Max Verstappen has already joined the greats and has no intensions of slowing down in 2023. Another win would see him become the just the fifth driver to score a half century of Grand Prix victories with Lewis Hamilton, Michael Schumacher, Sebastian Vettel and Alain Prost. Won last year's US GP from third on the grid.

RED BULL

TEAM PRINCIPAL CHRISTIAN HORNER

The heat is on Sergio Perez after another tough weekend in Qatar. Perez had no speed compared to his teammate qualifying 13th and just hanging onto a point in the Grand Prix after being caught up in a crash in the Sprint. Has never taken a Texas podium but did rise from ninth to fourth last year.

Lewis Hamilton is undeniably the king of COTA. He has won more than half of the races held there, while he has only missed the podium once in 2013. On every other occasion he has walked away with a trophy. Wants to rebound from a first-lap crash with teammate in Qatar.

TEAM PRINCIPAL MIKE KRACK

Qatar was a step in the right direction for Fernando Alonso but he needs more from his Aston Martin to stay in the fight for third. Has surprisingly struggled at the United States Grand Prix at both Indianapolis and Austin with just two podiums from 16 starts in 2007 and 2012. Progressed from 14th to seventh in 2022.

TEAM PRINCIPAL FRED VASSEUR

A string of four successive top five results has seen Charles Leclerc close in on his Ferrari teammate in the championship. Despite a disappointing Sprint, Leclerc kept the streak alive with a fifth in the GP. Put in a strong drive from 12th to the podium at COTA last year.

Carlos Sainz hopes to regain some points having missed out on the Sunday fun in Qatar. Sainz did not start the race due to an oil leak but finished sixth in the Sprint. Started from pole in Texas last year only to retire having been spun at turn one.

Lando Norris carries plenty of form into his 100th Grand Prix with a hat-trick of podiums under his belt. Despite this, he is feeling the pressure from Piastri and could not compete with the Aussie at Qatar, highlighted by a costly mistake in the Sprint shootout. Aiming for a first COTA top five.

TEAM PRINCIPAL TOTO WOLFF

Also raising the bat for a century of Grand Prix starts is George Russell. Two teammate clashes in a row have hurt the Brit, who was forced to retire from the Qatar GP. But still showed pace across the weekend, leading the Sprint until the tyres dropped away.



TEAM PRINCIPAL ZAC BROWN

Oscar Piastri became the first driver to win a race in his rookie year since Lewis Hamilton in 2007 by taking out a nail-biting Sprint in Qatar. The Aussie was strong across the entire weekend, finishing second best to Verstappen in Grand Prix having done the same in qualifying and beating him in the Shootout. Comes to COTA for the first time in hot form.


