

EVENT GUIDE AUTO ACTION'S 2023 PRE SAO PAULO FORMULA ONE TEAM-BY-TEAM EVENT GUIDE

FOR THE FINAL TIME IN 2023, FORMULA 1 GOES SPRINT RACING AND ACTION CAN BE CLOSE TO GUARANTEED AT THE SPECIAL SAO PAULO GRAND PRIX.

HAVING HOSTED Formula 1 for now exactly half a century Interlagos is probably the most famous and storied American venue on the calendar producing unforgettable scenes such as Ayrton Senna pushing through the pain barrier to win in front of his adoring fans or countless title-defining clashes.

Last year the race lived up to its unpredictable reputation with Kevin Magnussen taking a stunning pole for Haas, Lewis Hamilton and Max Verstappen colliding and George Russell scoring his long-awaited maiden Grand Prix win. It was the only occasion in a staggering run of 25 races Red Bull

Although Verstappen once again cruised to the chequered flag in Mexico, Red Bull may face a bigger challenge than what it has become used to from its rivals.

The Dutchman did lead through the first corner, but that was only after a flying start having been out qualified by both Ferraris.

This made it back to back pole positions for Charles Leclerc, who still scored a first podium in seven races despite carrying significant front wing damage.

Mercedes has also found its stride since its latest update and in particular

Hamilton has shown flashes of his best on the past two Sundays finishing on the road twice in both Texas and Mexico City.

Although Russell's podium less stretch now dates back to 12 races since Spain.

he has still moved forward from lower qualifying positions and will be fuelled by the sweet memories of 12 months ago.

Adding more motivation to the Brackley team will be Hamilton's pursuit to steal second in the championship from the struggling Sergio Perez.

After crashing out on the first lap on home soil being his latest disappointment, the Mexican only holds a 20-point advantage over the seven-time world

All the momentum is with Hamilton, who has closed the gap by 35 points over the last five races and could be all over Perez if it was not for the American disqualification.

The other driver Perez has to watch out for is Australia's Daniel Ricciardo, who was back to his best at Mexico.

Despite driving the much slower AlphaTauri, Ricciardo out qualified Perez and went on to score the team's best result of the year.

The Aussie will be aiming to replicate his mighty Mexican performance across the back end of the year to strengthen his case.

Oscar Piastri will be chasing more points in his first trip to Sao Paulo and whilst McLaren is playing down its chances due to the slow-speed second sector, it cannot be discounted.

If recent trips to Sao Paulo are anything to go by, strap yourself in for plenty of drama on all three days.

ROUND TWENTY ONE SAO PAULO GRAND PRIX - NOVEMBER 3-5

FOR ONE last time F1 goes Sprint racing and it arrives at the popular, carnival like Autodromo Jose Carlos Pace. The historic track has a fast, flowing start including the overtaking hotspot Senna S before a snaking infield section and the blast in front of the fans. Interlagos was constructed back in 1938 and features a number of challenging banked corners. Fifty years after its first ever Grand Prix, Interlagos remains a fan and driver favourite.



Despite being below his best in quali, he never looked back after an electric start. Infamously ignored team orders and clashed with Hamilton last year. Always scored points in Brazil and won a special 2019 race.

TEAM PRINCIPAL CHRISTIAN HORNER

No driver heads to Brazil under more pressure than Sergio Perez. After being out qualified by Daniel Ricciardo, Perez crashed out on lap one after making a bold and desperate move around the outside of turn one for the lead. Has never stood on the Interlagos podium before and needs to at least do that to stop speculation.

Another top four result has pushed Carlos Sainz into the top four ahead of Alonso. Has shown consistent pace across the last two races with third in USA and fourth in Mexico, plus out-qualifying Verstappen. Will be dreaming of another trophy at the track he soccer his breakthrough first podium at in 2019.

LANDO NORRIS

Fernando Alonso and Aston Martin are now struggling. Alonso has dropped to fifth in the championship following back to back retirements. Mexico was a battle with two spins on Friday and Saturday before debris damage led to a DNF. Has admitted to lacking confidence behind the wheel of the AMR23. Has eight podiums but no wins in Brazil.

TEAM PRINCIPAL ZAC BROWN

Lando Norris came alive at the back end of the Mexican Grand Prix to march from 17th to fifth. Uncertainly became the reason why Norris made the "silly" Q1 error but this did not stop him from charging ahead on Sunday, with great speed especially in the final stint helping him pick off rivals. Retired due to a gearbox failure 12 months ago.

Pierre Gasly lamented the "very unlucky timing with the Safety Car" as he fell 4s short of points in 11th. Qualified four spots ahead of teammate Ocon, who still manage to snatch 10th. Will never forget Interlagos thanks to his sensational second for Toro Rosso in the same year he was dropped by Red Bull.




